

## What data must be submitted to the Registry?

The data required for submission to the registry includes the UII; its pedigree data; and valuation, accountability, and configuration data.

### Pedigree:

- Acquisition Contract Information
- Original Part, Lot, or Batch Number
- Serial Number
- Shipment and Delivery Information

### Valuation:

- Initial Acquisition Value
- Major Modifications

### Accountability:

- Contractor Custody Information
- Acceptance Data
- Custodial Contract Data

### Configuration:

- Embedded Items
- Item Markings
- Part Number Changes
- Item Description

## How do I access the Registry?

The registry is accessible at <https://www.bpn.gov/iuid>.

If you are a prime contractor and your contract requires UIID submissions, or you are a contractor possessing DoD property, you are required to submit data to the registry.

Verification of UIID submission does not require registration, but all other functions do.

## What is UIID?

Item Unique Identification (UIID) is a Department of Defense (DoD) program that enables easy access to information about DoD possessions in order to make acquisition, repair, and deployment of items faster and more efficient.

UIID distinguishes one tangible item from another, therefore enabling the DoD to uniquely identify and track identical items individually throughout their lifecycles. With UIID, the DoD can consistently and accurately capture the value of items it buys, control these items during their life cycles, and combat counterfeiting of parts.

## What is the purpose of the UIID Registry?

The UIID Registry is the authorized repository that captures and stores the unique item identifier (UII) and its pedigree data. The data associated with each UII includes what the item is, its original owner, its initial value, acceptance timing, and other valuable information.

The registry is the definitive source for information about how a uniquely identified item was procured, what it cost the government to own the item, what major events happen to that item over its lifetime, and how an item was disposed. As DoD information systems become more net-centric, the registry will support lifecycle visibility for tangible items; integrating financial, maintenance, and accountability systems.

The registry is also the single authorized source for paperless reporting of Government Furnished Property (GFP).

## How do I submit data to the Registry?

The preferred data submission method is performed through the Wide Area Work Flow (WAWF), a Paperless Contracting environment. The WAWF enables contractors to transmit shipping notices electronically and DoD to perform both receipt and acceptance electronically. One of the key benefits to WAWF is a reduction in the number of days it takes for contractors to receive approval and payment of invoices submitted to DoD. Use of the WAWF Receiving Report (RR) and the WAWF Combo to capture the IUID data is annotated in the enhanced Vendor guides. New users can reach WAWF on the Internet at <https://wawf.eb.mil/> and follow the link called “Self Register to use WAWF (New Users)” to obtain access. When IUID data is transmitted as part of the WAWF submission, the IUID Registry will be automatically updated and no other contractor action is required.

The following methods may also be used to submit data to the IUID Registry by organizations that have not established access to WAWF:

- Via GEX
  - XML file/transaction
  - Data may be submitted via an X12 Ship Notice/Shipment and Billing Notice (856/857) transaction
- Date may be entered manually via the IUID Web Entry Site at <https://www.bpn.gov/iuid>

To submit data into the Registry, you will need a password after registering on the site. Instructions on how to register for a login are provided on the “controlled access” log-in page.

Log-ins are provided upon request only to government employees and to U.S. Government Contractors with approval from a Department of Defense Program Manager or equivalent.
