Brigadier General Darryl A. Scott became the Director of the Defense Contract Management Agency on December 5th, 2003. As the Director, Brig Gen Scott is responsible for leading and managing over 11,500 civilian and military leaders, managers and technical experts to perform worldwide acquisition life cycle contract management for Department of Defense weapon system programs, spares, supplies and services. This includes ensuring on-time delivery, at the right cost and in accordance with performance standards prescribed in over 325,000 contracts valued at over \$852 billion with over 25,000 domestic and foreign contractors.

A native of Washington, D.C., Brig Gen Scott entered the Air Force after graduating from the U.S. Air Force Academy in June 1974. Brig Gen Scott has served as a principal contracting officer for space, missile, aircraft, and C4ISR. He has twice commanded and has served staff tours at both Major Command and Air Staff levels.

Prior to assuming his current position, Brig Gen Scott served as Vice Commander, Warner Robins Air Logistics Center, Air Force Material Command, Robins Air Force Base, GA.
