SUBJECT: National Disability Employment Awareness Month and the AbilityOne Program

On September 30, 2015, President Obama signed a proclamation in observance of National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM). The President noted in the Proclamation that it is the 70th anniversary of NDEAM. We take this opportunity to pay tribute to the accomplishments of the employees in the AbilityOne Program. This Program enables more than 45,000 Americans who are blind or have other significant disabilities to find positive employment on Federal contracts. This includes more than 3,000 veterans and service-disabled veterans who perform work on these contracts.

The Department of Defense (DoD) remains the leading customer of the Program, procuring more than \$1.7 billion during FY 2015, which equates to 62 percent of AbilityOne's business and an estimated 35,000 jobs for people with disabilities. In this environment of reduced budgets, your continued support of AbilityOne and compliance with the Federal Acquisition Regulation Subpart 8.7 are critical to provide individuals with disabilities every opportunity to contribute to the defense mission and lead independent lives.

Congratulations to the contracting workforce professionals, identified in the attached, who have demonstrated exemplary leadership and commitment in action over the past year to increasing business with AbilityOne.
