## What is the DoD IUID Registry ?



The Department of Defense (DoD) Item Unique Identification (IUID) Registry is a relational database operated under the auspices of the Business Transformation Agency (BTA), and sponsored by the Defense Procurement and Acquisition Policy (DPAP) Office in the Office of the Secretary of Defense, Acquisition, Technology and Logistics. The IUID Registry Program Office is hosted by the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), Defense Logistics Information Service (DLIS). The IUID Registry is the authoritative repository for all DoD IUID data. More than 8.9 million items have thus far been registered; 40% of those items were delivered under calendar year 2009 and the pace of registration is accelerating. Official estimates put the entire DoD qualifying inventory at about 90 million items.

## Why do I care and what's in it for me?

The IUID Registry is a truly *transformational union of acquisition and logistics data* that enables asset visibility DoD-wide. Using the machine-readable Unique Item Identifier (UII) on DoD assets DoD Components can track, catalog, and inventory using commercially available technology in any theater of operation and on any platform. If you manage equipment, spare parts, or any DoD serially-managed item, IUID will affect your processes and planning. By implementing and utilizing IUID we move to a common DoD standard for item management.

The IUID Registry captures data from many systems and submitters, including acquisition data from Wide Area Workflow (WAWF) and XML and flat file submissions from depots, shipyards, bases, airfields, and maintenance shops around the world. Additional feeds of lifecycle event data are reported by property managers, Government Furnished Property (GFP) custodial contractors, all of the uniformed services, and attendant property reporting systems. These systems will have additional, more detailed information on individual items, while the IUID Registry hosts the “pedigree data” on the item.

The IUID Registry has a web interface at <https://www.bpn.gov/iuid> for users with credentials to add, update, and correct small numbers of items. Users can also retrieve useful, approved data in the form of reports and queries.

## Who has access to the IUID Registry?

Anyone can access certain limited item information through the IUID Registry's Public Access Query. Users with a need to know detailed IUID information can request Controlled Access to the IUID Registry at <https://www.bpn.gov/BRS>.

## *What can I do with my access?*

Depending on your access level, some or all of the following functions will be available:

- ✓ Add new, legacy, or legacy GFP items, either as end items or as items embedded in "parent" items.
- ✓ Update items with custody changes, changes to the marks on an item, changes to the composition of an item (configuration changes including embedding or un-embedding of uniquely identified items), and lifecycle events such as lost, destroyed, loaned, or reintroduced.
- ✓ Correct item information for up to 60 days after entry, if the item was originally entered via the website.
- ✓ Query the database for additional information on individual items or groups of items.
- ✓ Request and view reports that provide information on single items or groups of items to assist in tracking and maintaining items.
