


SUBJECT: Sustaining End-to-End Acquisition Electronic Business Applications

The Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics (AT&L) organization has recently re-organized and, as a result, on October 1, 2002 the directorates of Defense Procurement and Acquisition Initiatives were merged into Defense Procurement & Acquisition Policy. To ensure continued viability and operational capability, the Defense Procurement & Acquisition Policy is identified as the principal staff assistant (PSA) and functional requirements owner for the following initiatives:

- Central Contractor Registration (CCR)
- DoD Business Opportunities (DoDBusOpps)
- Electronic Document Access (EDA)
- Past Performance Information Retrieval System (PPIRS)
- Technical Data Solutions (TeDS)
- Wide Area Workflow (WAWF)

Each of these initiatives is providing improved operational capability and helping to transform DoD business processes and promote interoperability. Collectively, they are providing capabilities that can be exported across the federal government and potentially also be shared with state and local governments. DISA and DLA must develop a plan, which includes resource requirements, for continued sustainment of these programs for FY04-09 with appropriate program management in place for each. The plan also must include agreements for sustaining the current operational capability during FY03. This plan is due to both Defense Procurement & Acquisition Policy and DoD CIO on January 31, 2003.
