

Cancellation of Class Determination of Domestic Non-Availability (DNAD)

For

**Dual Compression-Molded Ethyl Vinyl Acetate (EVA) for Midsoles
and Non-Marking Solid Rubber for Outsoles in
Men's and Women's Running Shoes**

Pursuant to the authority contained in 10 U.S.C. 2533a (the "Berry Amendment"), I hereby make the following findings and determination concerning dual compression molded EVA for midsoles and non-marking solid rubber for outsoles in men's and women's running shoes.

FINDINGS

On July 16, 2006, the USD(AT&L) determined, pursuant to the Berry Amendment, satisfactory quality and sufficient quantity of dual compression-molded EVA for midsoles and non-marking solid rubber for outsoles in men's and women's running shoes compliant with the Berry Amendment could not be procured at U.S. market prices when needed.


The Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Troop Support January 24 DNAD report states the cancellation of the DNAD for dual compression-molded EVA for midsoles and non-marking solid rubber for outsoles in men's and women's running shoes is recommended because the Air Force no longer demands running shoes containing this component. A decision has been made by DLA to discontinue procuring this item.

DETERMINATION

I hereby determine the DNAD for dual compression-molded EVA for midsoles and non-marking solid rubber for outsoles in men's and women's running shoes is no longer a requirement of the U.S. Armed Forces. This requirement applies to contacts awarded after the date of this determination.
