

**Cancellation of Class Determination of Domestic Non-Availability (DNAD)**

**For**

**Cationic – Dyeable Continuous Filament Polyester Tow**

Pursuant to the authority contained in 10 U.S.C. 2533a (the “Berry Amendment”), I hereby make the following findings and determination concerning Cationic – Dyeable Continuous Filament Polyester Tow.

**FINDINGS**

On July 8, 2002, the USD(AT&L) determined, pursuant to the Berry Amendment, that satisfactory quality and sufficient quantity of Cationic – Dyeable Continuous Filament Polyester Tow that complies with the Berry Amendment could not be procured as and when needed at U.S. market prices.

The Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Troop Support Annual DNAD Report of January 24, 2011, states the cancellation of the DNAD for Cationic – Dyeable Continuous Filament Polyester Tow is recommended because three domestic sources have been identified.

**DETERMINATION**

I hereby determine that the DNAD for Cationic – Dyeable Continuous Filament Polyester Tow is no longer a requirement of the U.S. Armed Forces. This requirement applies to contacts awarded after the date of this determination.
