SUBJECT: Continuing FY 2010 Appropriations Act Provisions

Reference DPAP memorandum dated January 19, 2011, Subject: Continuing Appropriations Act Authorities. As you are aware, in the absence of a Department of Defense Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2011, the Department is receiving funding under continuing resolution appropriations for FY 2011.

Contracting officers and grants officials are reminded that the provisions of the Department of Defense Appropriations Act 2010, Public Law 111-118, continue in effect, including the provision restricting funds provided to the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN) or any of its affiliates, subsidiaries, or allied organizations under grants and contracts. This prohibition also applies to a sub-recipient (e.g., a subcontractor, sub-grantee, or a contractor of a grantee).
