







# Statutes

- **\$2460. Definition of depot-level maintenance and repair**  
Material maintenance or repair requiring the overhaul, upgrading, or rebuilding of parts, assemblies, or subassemblies, and the testing and reclamation of equipment as necessary, regardless of the source of funds for the maintenance or repair or the location at which the maintenance or repair is performed. Includes all aspects of software maintenance.
- **\$2464. Core logistics capabilities**  
It is essential for the national defense that the Department of Defense maintain a core logistics capability that is Government-owned and Government-operated (including Government personnel and Government-owned and Government-operated equipment and facilities) to ensure a ready and controlled source of technical competence and resources necessary to ensure effective and timely response to a mobilization, national defense contingency situations, and other emergency requirements.
- **\$2466. Limitations on the performance of depot-level maintenance**  
Not more than 50 percent of the funds made available in a fiscal year to a military department or a Defense Agency for depot-level maintenance and repair workload may be used to contract for the performance by non-Federal Government personnel of such workload for the military department or the Defense Agency.
- **\$2474. Centers of Industrial and Technical Excellence and PPPs**  
The Secretary concerned, or the Secretary of Defense in the case of a Defense Agency, shall designate each depot-level activity or military arsenal facility of the military departments and the Defense Agencies as a Center of Industrial and Technical Excellence in the recognized core competencies of the designee. The Secretary designating a Center of Industrial and Technical Excellence may authorize and encourage the head of the Center to enter into public-private cooperative arrangements (partnership).
- **\$2476. Minimum capital investment for certain depots**  
Each fiscal year, the Secretary of a military department shall invest in the capital budgets of the covered depots of that military department a total amount equal to not less than six percent of the average total combined maintenance, repair, and overhaul workload funded at all the depots of that military department for the preceding three fiscal years.
