SUBJECT: Class of 2007-2008 Maintenance Management Fellowship Program

The purpose of this memorandum is to request nominations for the 2007-2008 Maintenance Management Fellowship Program. This training program, which has been in existence for 29 years, is one year in length and designed to enhance the career development patterns for selected military and civilian mid-level management personnel at the O-4/O-5, GS-12 to GS-14 level. Personnel considered for nomination are expected to have demonstrated significant potential for advancement in the logistics/maintenance career field. Nominations should be carefully screened to ensure nominees meet this requirement.

I invite your nominations for the 2007-2008 program by May 1, 2007. Acceptances will be made by May 15, 2007. The one year training program will commence at a mutually convenient time between August 1-October 1, 2007. The Department of the Navy is encouraged to nominate a Navy and a Marine Corps candidate.

Civilian nominations should include an updated resume and the most recent performance appraisal. The Military Departments should assign the Fellows accepted for training into a formal training billet. All expenses for the nominees will be borne by the nominee's parent organization. Expenses include salary, travel, transportation costs, per diem, and living expenses.

The Maintenance Management Fellowship Program provides a significant opportunity for Headquarters-level experience and benefits to the participants, their Service/Agency, and the Department of Defense logistics/maintenance community as a whole. I encourage your strong support of this program to further the executive development of our future logistics/maintenance leaders.
