GATE REVIEW PROCESS

- **The DON “Gate Review” process is where logistics and its effects manifests itself as part of overall program execution**
 - **Stakeholders, including sustainment bill payers, are members throughout the Gate reviews**
 - **Standard slide templates are briefed to include:**
 - **Sustainment ‘Quad Chart’**
 - **Program Health – Probability of Program Success (PoPs) Criteria**
 - **Total Ownership Costs**



DON Urgent Needs and Sustainment

- Urgent needs generally do **not** go through the 'normal' acquisition review processes, and thus do not have the **formalized** sustainment requirements of a program of record
- DEPSECDEF has stressed the importance of the Department maintaining and sustaining the equipment in theater
- Sustainment issues ongoing with urgent needs:
 - Funding: determine the current and out-years
 - Training: determine how to train the warfighter as units rotate in and out of theater
 - Manpower: determine the number of personnel to train and maintain the equipment (normally through FSRs)
 - Spares: determine the sparing level required to keep the capability operational
 - Retrograde: determine what stays in country and transitions to the ANSF or other allies, what is transitioned to a U.S. enduring requirement, or what is demilitarized/disposed
