Performance



- Pilot testing in numerous customer facilities
- Wide variety of products tagged
- Reliable pallet and case reads demonstrated in defined use cases
- Read range and read speed meet user expectations
- Class 1 tags and readers available from multiple suppliers (22 at last count)

Interoperability

- No industry-sanctioned interoperability testing yet available from independent lab (in planning)
- Users relying on tag/reader vendor cooperation and system integrators to ensure acceptable operation in specific cases
- Agile readers are being developed, but little practical field experience yet

System Integration



- Middleware solutions available to tie tag data into enterprise information systems
- Hybrid barcode/RFID tags enable quickest and smoothest initial implementation
- RFID-enabled applications now being announced by major SW suppliers

Services

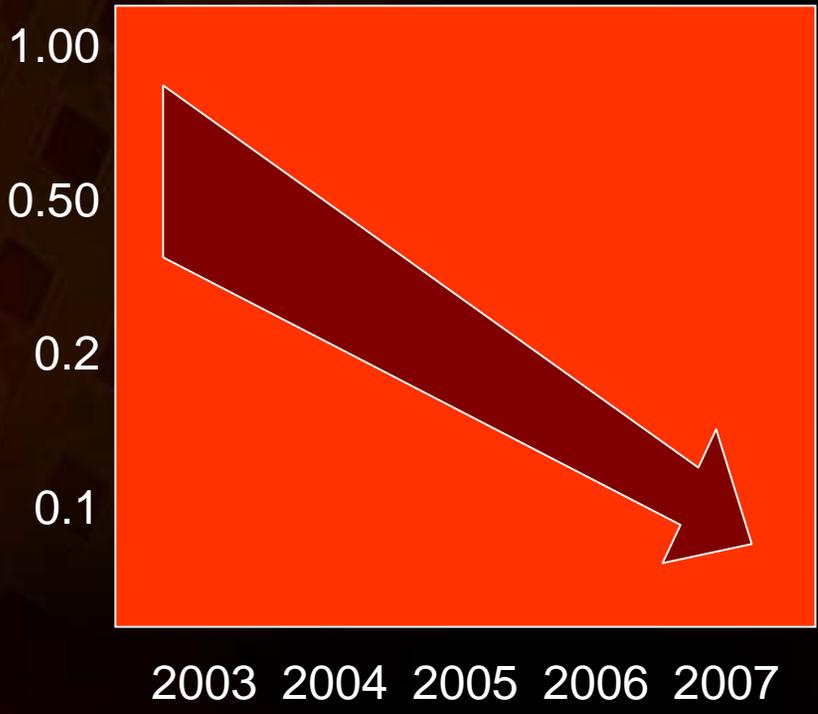


- Education: hands-on boot camp approach very successful; leads to intelligent evaluation of options by users
- Pilot: site survey, installation & integration services
- Adoption: tag evaluation to match tags to products for each class of SKU

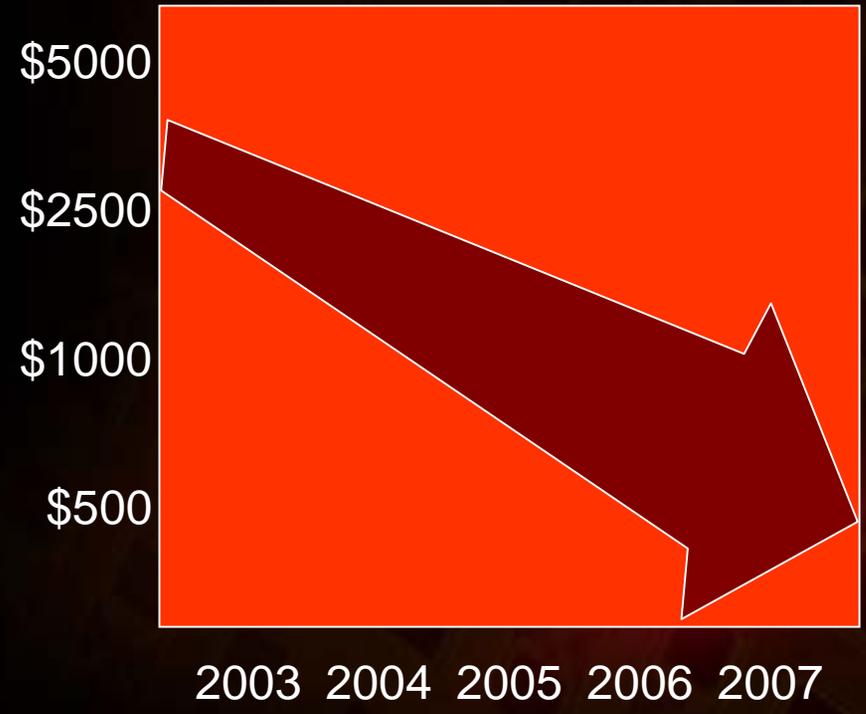
Cost Trends
