

Is Your Technology A Candidate for TTI Funding?

1. Will the technology fulfill a stated service/agency capability shortfall? Y/N
 - a. What service/agency?
 - b. What stated capability shortfall?
2. Will the technology benefit Joint or Multi-Service capability? Y/N
3. Does the technology have the support of the end-state user? Y/N
4. Has the technology been funded by previous S&T money? Y/N
 - a. What S&T organization?
 - b. How much invested and when?
5. Is the technology mature? Y/N
 - a. What is the current and projected (at end of TTI project) TRL?
 - b. By whom?
6. Does the technology have an acquisition/procurement path? Y/N
 - a. Acquisition Process (Program & PE #) or
 - b. Procurement Process or
 - c. GSA catalog
7. Have acquisition/procurement funds been identified/POMd? Y/N
8. Is the duration of the “transition funding” 4 years or less? Y/N
9. Is there transition cost sharing between TTI and Service/Agency? Y/N
 - a. Service/Agency transition funding can be up to 50% of transition costs.

If you answer “no” to any of the above questions, your program might not meet the requirements for TTI. Funds are extremely limited and priority will be given to programs that can answer “yes” to all the above questions and will provide the best return on investment to DoD and the warfighters.
