
Procure-to-Pay Capability Summary

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SUBJECT: Request for Equitable Adjustment (REA) Tracker Tool

BACKGROUND: Section 855 of the 2019 Department of Defense (DoD) National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), "Construction Contract Administration", calls for agencies to provide information on their policies regarding Requests for Equitable Adjustments (REAs) (also see Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Parts 52.243 and 52.236) and the timeliness with which the agency has definitized REAs in the past. This information is intended to assist businesses planning to bid on solicitations to account for potential delays in REA adjudication. Defense Pricing and Contracting (DPC) has created the REA Tracker to enable DoD services and agencies to capture data on their REAs in a centralized database for use in meeting the NDAA reporting requirements. The tool will track REAs against DoD contracts. Information on individual DoD REAs will be aggregated and provided in a dashboard for use in solicitations as required. The FAR and the Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement (DFARS) have been updated to include this requirement.

POLICY: The REA Tracker Tool was implemented based on the guidance found in Section 855 of the 2019 DoD National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). Reference FAR Parts 52.243, 52.236 and 36.211, and the DFARS Procedures, Guidance, and Information (PGI) Subpart 236.2 on the distribution of advance notices and solicitations contains instructions for contracting personnel to include this data.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE: The REA Tracker Tool is hosted in the Procurement Integrated Enterprise Environment (PIEE) at <https://piee.eb.mil> and will have a single sign-on option via PIEE.

DATA STANDARDS: The data captured in the REA Tracker Tool is mandated by the FAR Section 36.211. Details can be found in the REA Tracker Guide posted in PIEE.

IMPACT: The REA Tracker will increase visibility into REA policies and timeliness. Aggregate information provided to potential bidders via solicitations or other announcements will enable those vendors to plan for potential schedule impacts due to REA adjudications.

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
