SUBJECT: Government Furnished Property (GFP) Module Overview

BACKGROUND: The GFP Module, deployed as a new application in the Procurement Integrated Enterprise Environment (PIEE) April 2018, provides a single face to industry for reporting and tracking GFP. The GFP Module consolidates all information about GFP throughout the GFP lifecycle and is used by DoD and industry to ensure collaboration and a common view of authorized and actual GFP.

POLICY: Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR) Part 45 and Defense Acquisition Regulations Supplement (DFARS) Part 245 establish requirements for government and contractor responsibility for GFP. The required GFP clauses are FAR 52.245-1, DFARS 252.245-7001 through -7004 and DFARS 252.211-7007. DFARS PGI 245.103-72 "Government-furnished property attachments to solicitations and awards" provides additional direction on the method to identify authorized GFP as part of the contract. DFARS 252.211-7007 (f) provides a link to the Vendor Guide that directs reporting of GFP to the GFP Module.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE: DoD users use the GFP Module to create the GFP Attachment that authorizes a contractor to have custody of government property. The GFP Attachment data is available for reuse during the lifecycle of GFP tracking in the GFP Module including Property Transfer, Property Loss, and Plant Clearance. The technical roadmap includes the future ability for contractors to update information about GFP items in their custody and the development of robust interfaces to DoD Accountable Property Systems of Record.

DATA STANDARDS: The GFP Module leverages Defense Logistics Management Standards (DLMS) where possible to ensure data reuse.

IMPACT: When fully deployed, the GFP Module will provide end-to-end visibility and accountability of GFP. With future integration with the Department's Accountable Property Systems of Record (APSR), the GFP Module will address deficiencies identified in the Department's material weakness related to property in the possession of contractors. FAR and DFARS requirements provide the foundation for GFP Module implementation which is occurring in phases. The GFP Module currently enables creation, review, and approval of the GFP Attachment and tracking of GFP accountability to and from contractors through reporting of physical shipment and receipt. The Property Loss capability was implemented in late 2019 and dispositioning via the Plant Clearance capability in 2021. Implementation will conclude with inclusion of the ability for contractors to update information about the GFP items in their custody and deeper integration with APSRs. The GFP Module enables reuse of data entered in the early phases of the GFP lifecycle to reduce data entry burden and increase data quality over the life of the GFP. Enhanced reporting provides visibility to DoD and contractors of GFP accountable to a contract or a contractor. This information establishes key supporting documents used during investigations and financial audit.
