



## Biography

### **Mr. Tracy E. Tynan**

#### **Office of the Secretary of Defense Acquisition & Sustainment**

Mr. Tracy E. Tynan is a member of the Senior Executive Service, and is Executive Director, Joint Rapid Acquisition Cell (JRAC). In this role, he is responsible for monitoring the progress and completion of actions to satisfy Urgent Operational Needs (UONs) identified by the combatant commands. In addition, he serves as the Executive Secretary to the Warfighter Senior Integration Group (SIG).



Previously, he served as Director, Space and Missile Defense programs in the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD), Acquisition & Sustainment, providing guidance and recommendations on a \$9B portfolio. Mr. Tynan also served as the Deputy Overarching Integrated Product Team (OIPT) Leader, Office of the Deputy Chief Management Officer (DCMO), Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD). In this role, he served as a key stakeholder for the acquisition and procurement of all DoD Defense Business Systems, to include five Enterprise Resource Systems (ERP) implementations, a \$7B portfolio.

Mr. Tynan has also previously served as the Director, Acquisition Center of Excellence for the Business Transformation Agency, a DoD Agency, with oversight of approximately 23 acquisition programs and projects. While serving on active duty with the Air Force for over 26 years, he was a Program Director, the Single Manager, responsible for all acquisition and sustainment activities for 385 commercial derivative aircraft of forty mission design series, including airlift, tanker, executive transport, telemetry, training, airborne command and control, and the U.S. Presidential aircraft fleet at Andrews AFB, MD.

His other assignments included serving as a Program Manager for two highly classified government efforts valued at over \$2.2B, and as Deputy Director in the Military Satellite Communications (MILSATCOM) Terminals System Program Office. Further, he was Program Manager for the Distributed Common Ground System (AF DCGS), acquiring and sustaining eighteen Defense Intelligence systems worth \$510M.

While serving as Program Manager, Joint Expeditionary Force Experiment (JEFX), the Air Force's largest experimentation exercise, he led a combined government and contractor team overseeing the design and implementation of an \$80M command and control experiment. Results of the experiment were directly transitioned to the CENTCOM AOR and 19 Air Operation Centers.

While a Division Chief on the Air Staff, he led Air Staff personnel planning, programming, budgeting and defending execution activities for 28 future Command, Control, Communications, Computers, Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (C4ISR) acquisition programs totaling \$12.3 billion. Previously, he served as a Senior Standardization Evaluation Missile Crew Commander in the Minuteman ICBM weapon system, and served on The White House Staff for three years in support of two Presidents.

Mr. Tynan graduated from The Citadel, The Military College of South Carolina, and earned an M.S. in Management, from Lesley College. He also has an M.S. in National Resource Strategy from the Eisenhower School, National Defense University. He is a Level III certified Program Manager, and attended the Executive Leadership Seminar at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, NC.
